I. Essential History Vocabulary

- Write a synonym for each italicized term (7);
- for each underlined term, write a sentence giving an example from history using the term (13);
- for each bold term draw an illustration (5).

Record each definition on a white 3 x 5 notecard. These cards will be turned in on the first day of class. Put your name on the first card in the stack. Bind them together with a rubber band. Your last card should contain the sources used for each term: if you used dictionary.com for all, then you have one source. Include sources utilized for maps also. Label this card: Source Card

Definition Card Example:

Communism: a political theory taken from Karl Marx which advocates class war leading to a society in which all property is publicly owned and each person works and is paid according to their abilities and needs.
Synonym: collectivism
