# Third Grade Summer Reading Project "Can a Character"

## What You Need:

coffee can or large soup can  
construction paper  
fabric scraps  
glue  
scissors

colored yarn  
crayons, colored pencils or markers  
index cards cut into strips  
any other craft materials

## What You Do:

1. Read a biography from the Summer Reading List.
2. Make the can look like the character by cutting and gluing on pieces of construction paper, fabric, yarn, or any other craft materials.
